

With a profound 100 dB hearing loss, Jim Kyte remains the only deaf player to have played in the NHL. Upon retiring from his professional hockey career in 1998, Jim Kyte had logged 640 regular season and playoff games over 13 seasons with five teams - Winnipeg, Pittsburgh, Calgary, Ottawa and San Jose. Growing up in a family with five boys and one girl, Jim Kyte has always known what it means to be part of a team. The Kyte family was a louder than normal household because all the boys, including his father, Dr. John Kyte, were hearing impaired. Growing up with a profound hearing loss has many physical, emotional and mental challenges but having parents as strong role models to look up to played a pivotal role in Jim's upbringing.

3P**Strategy Needed...to combat Human Trafficking**

Human beings are bought and sold for sexual exploitation, forced or bonded labour, and marriage. The more vulnerable the person, the more at risk they are for human trafficking. This session will highlight work that is underway in Windsor-Essex County to provide direct services to survivors of Human Trafficking, including identification of risk factors and vulnerabilities, coordination with community partners and intensive case management/support. Human Trafficking is real in communities across Ontario and people with developmental disabilities are being targeted. The first step to developing a strategy to combat Human Trafficking is to understand and acknowledge the problem. Come prepared to take the first step!
