### Transforming Services in Ontario for People who have a Developmental Disability

#### Vita Community Living Services' Response to Questions for Discussion:

- 1. What should be the roles and responsibilities of different parts of society in supporting individuals who have a developmental disability?
- Stable funding that includes cost of living
- Ensure Cross-Sector and Inter-Ministerial Planning and Collaboration
- Mandatory Services/Entitlement
- Address discrepancies in staff wages compared to similar fields, i.e. average wage in school board for a DSW \$21.00/hr in community agency \$15.00/hr
- Employer Incentives to hire
- Education and Policy development/clarification on use of ODSP
- Portable funding
- Individualized funding
- Consistency and Definition of what is a developmental disability
- Public awareness campaign to address knowledge about our field and greater community acceptance.

## 2. What strategies and resources would help individuals receive seamless supports throughout their lives, including points of transition?

- Early Identification and Individualized impartial life plans
- Portable funding so family can move within Province without jeopardizing supports
- Individualized Funding
- Clear One Stop Access to Information on Resource and Services
- Equalization among ministries of resources, i.e. in school often get 1:1 support upon graduation nothing or if able to access a program ratio becomes 1:4/1:10, etc., lack of access to mental health, lack of appropriately trained health workers
- Partnership between community services and Ministry of Education to start planning for children at age 14.
- Ensure families are provided with thorough information throughout their child's life span of resources this includes ensuring school boards and heads of special education are fully aware of all community supports

## 3. What supports and services that are currently available work well and should be built on for the future?

- Continued variety of models in all types of support, not all want individualized funding
- Centralized short term case management and individualized impartial life planning
- Crisis Supports
- Respite Supports, need more out of home options

- Need to set standards to ensure quality control, need to hold community accountable for funds and services being provided
- Foundations is great but too limiting, bigger waiting list of individuals not eligible for foundations, those with greater needs are more desperate for service
- Foundation or day programs should be available to all students leaving the school system

### 4. How should a reasonable level of government funding for an individual be determined?

- need an assessment tool used provincially that recognizes individual needs, quality of life, regional costs (i.e. cost of housing in Toronto compared to Timmins)
- assessment tools should be completed by both the agency and the family and/or an independent/impartial assessor.
- need annual cost of living increases to ensure stabilization of resources
- need early identification for future planning and allocation
- need inter-ministerial cooperation in identification and support provision
- need to recognize flexibility in funding to address changing needs

# 5. Services are changing in Ontario for people who have a developmental disability. What would you like to see happen?

- Changes to regulations pertaining to municipal and provincial by-laws on housing (i.e. fire code, location, etc.)
- Legislation on what services are mandatory
- Public Awareness about Sector
- Individualized Assessments and Funding based on those Assessments
- Development of more residential options

#### 6. What do you think are the priorities the government should address?

- Funding for Community Awareness and Public Relations to build a caring a responsive community
- Stable Funding, cost of living, staff salaries, benefits and training, pay equity
- Development of Action Plan to address Waitlists
- New Resources not to be dictated for a specific service, i.e. SIL and not needing that resource in that community
- Housing
- Improved and Accountable Educational System that works in unison with developmental services.
- 7. Is there anything else you would like to say about the ideas in this discussion paper, or ideas not included in the paper that you feel are important?

- Change to current system is important but need to ensure we don't destroy what we have while we make changes
- Need to recognize what is working well
- Need to ensure follow through on implementation with a clear multi-year plan
- Need to ensure we don't develop a one plan fits all approach
- Need to ensure legislation changes before operational changes are made
- Need to ensure clear accountability on the use of all funds: ODSP, SSHP, TPA base funding
